The Lord's Supper Instructions

We observe the Lord's Supper every week in worship. This communion meal is meant to unite us to Jesus Christ as well as each other. In it, we reaffirm the promises of our baptism and recommit ourselves to love and serve God and neighbor. We prepare to celebrate the Lord's Supper by putting our trust in Christ, confessing our sin, and seeking reconciliation with God and one another.

While we are being served communion at the table, the pastor will bring both bread and cup to all who are seated and cannot come to the table.

If you would like to pray with someone, our elders are available during communion to pray with you. Please come to the front of the sanctuary where they are waiting for you.

At the end of all being served, a deacon will come to the table and take from the table some bread and cups and exit up the aisle.

Later that day and during the week the deacons will take these to our members who could not attend worship, thus extending the communion to all our members.

If you are not a Christian, please consider using this communion time to pray with one of the following printed prayers:

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth and the life. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior. Amen.

Lenten Small Group - Matthew Discussion

#6

As a small group, read and discuss the following.

Begin your time in prayer, inviting the Holy Spirit to inspire the hearing of his word—to plant the truth of Jesus in the hearts of his disciples.

Read Matthew 16:13-28

1. What questions about the text come to your mind?
2. This section, along with next week's text on the Transfiguration of Jesus, is the climactic moment of Jesus' ministry before his passion week. Why does it seem important?
3. In verses 21-22, after Peter has correctly confessed that Jesus is the Messiah and Son of God, he presumes to tell Jesus what to do. Are you ever tempted to dictate how Jesus should behave? How does he correct you for such presumption?
4. Reread verses 24-26. In Dietrich Bonhoeffer's famous work, *The Cost of Discipleship*, the martyr pastor contrasts "cheap grace" from a grace that costs us our lives:
[Costly] grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of his Son: "ye were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us.
How do you reckon with Jesus' call to follow him by dying to yourself?
5. What area of your life requires a death to self, denial of self-interest, in order to follow Christ more heartily?

This week is the last Sunday for Small Groups, but you can read the preaching text for next week, Easter Sunday: Matthew 17:1-13.
